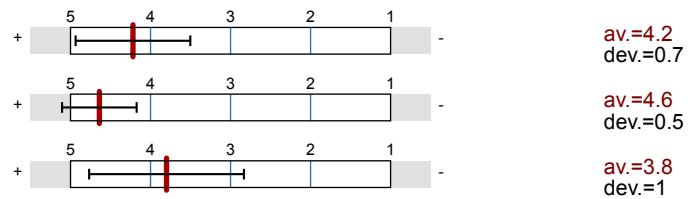

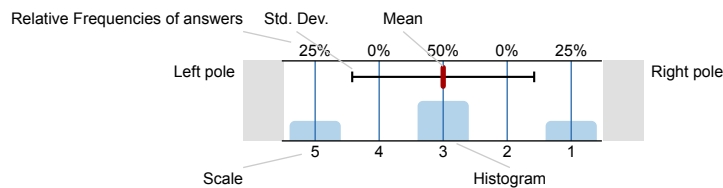

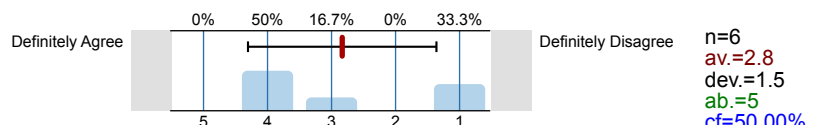
- It would be good if the classes were slightly longer, maybe 90 minutes, although I assume in that situation class size would increase and the quality would decrease.

- Lecture- reading integration
- Lectures don't really link to readings. Too much content for the amount of time we have in lectures and classes, meaning it is all very superficial and never really get into any depth. Doesn't really help when trying to answer essay questions. More guidance on how to answer essays and how one can use the theories learnt each week in essays on that topic. Teaching seems very distant to exam
- Maybe more class time so the readings can be discussed in more detail.
- More depth/time for complex issues
Chance for more independent thinking as opposed to subscribing to a number of assumptions.
Challenging the assumptions briefly don't always help
- There is a lot of content and I would prefer if we went into more depth on a fewer number of topics. As an introductory course I understand that a very deep understanding isn't expected but we seem to fly through a substantial topic with just a graph for reference on occasions.
- There should be clarification for what is required for the exam. I spend lots of time making notes on superfluous parts of readings and not focussing instead on the essential parts.
